UNITED VAN LINES PASSES ISO 9001:2000 AUDIT TO RETAIN CERTIFICATION

McClure, president and chief operating officer of UniGroup, the parent company of United Van Lines.

NQA is the impartial auditor who evaluated the effectiveness and completeness of the quality management system before recommending United’s registration.
